## Welcome Address

Vice-Principal Ms Santha



#### 1. Punctuality

Students are to assemble in the School Hall/Parade Square or Classroom by 7.30 am for morning assembly.

#### 2. Attire - Uniform ©

- Half Uniform t-shirts to be tucked in for a smart and neat look as students.
- Skirts knee length and comfortable fit
- Pants comfortable fit and long pants must be altered to its correct length
  - i.e., be in contact with the back of shoes when standing upright.
- Plain white shoes and socks.

#### 3. Grooming

- Hair must be kep**neat** in its **natural colour**.
- Outlandish, undercut/sideshaved/unkempt or dyect/loured/highlighted hair is not allowed.

#### 3a Grooming for Girls

- Long hair (below collar/shoulder length) to be tied up neathonytails, plaits, etc., with darkcolouredhair bands (black, dark blue)
- Fringe should be short not cover the eyebrows; long fringe should be neatly pinned up such that the forehead and eyebrows are not covered
- Multiple earrings or ear sticks are not allowed.

#### 3b. Grooming for Boys

- Hair must be short and neat.
- Hair should be sloped and when combed down should not touch the eyebrows, the ears and the collar.
- Boys must maintain a cleashaven appearance at all times in schood moustache, no sideurns, beards

#### 4. Accessories

- Girls one pair of simple, plain ear studs.
- No other accessories jewellery like chains, bracelets, rings or friendship bands, nose-studs
- Short fingernails for safety and hygiene reasons.

#### 5. Handphone Policy

- a key distraction
- handphones are switched-off at all times during curriculum hours
- handphones to be kept in pockets or bags during curriculum hours
- can be used before and after school and during recess
- Students may be barred from bringing handphones to school should they repeatedly breach the school rules on use of handphones.
- parents to avoid communications during curriculum hours
- in exceptional circumstances like family emergency, parents can contact the school to reach their children
- Parents can leverage apps, like Family Link, to manage handphone use

### A. MOE Promotion Criteria

All students must meet the promotion criteria to be promoted to the next level of study

Stream	Criteria for Promotion
2 Normal (Technical)	A pass in 2 subjects, one of which should be <b>English Language</b> or <b>Mathematics</b>
2 Normal (Academic)	A pass in <b>English Language</b> and <b>2</b> other subjects <u>OR</u> A pass in <b>4</b> subjects
2 Express	A pass in English Language AND a minimum of 50% for the average of all subjects combined

## B. MOE Criteria for Lateral Transfer to a More Challenging Stream

Students must meet the criteria for lateral transfer to be transferred to a more challenging stream

Stream	Lateral Transfer to	Criteria for Lateral Transfer
Sec 2NA	Sec 3E	More than 70% or higher in the average for all subjects and deemed to be able to cope with the Express Course
Sec 2NT	Sec 2NA	More than 70% or higher in the average for all subjects and deemed to be able to cope with the Normal (Academic) Course



### Sec 3 Subject Combination Exercise



- Sec 3 Subject Combination Exercise provides students with opportunities to choose subject combination based on **academic merit** and **interest** in subjects offered.
- The subject combinations offered will help prepare our students to pursue post-secondary education courses at the various tertiary institutions including JCs, Polytechnics and the ITEs supports students' aspirations.
- There is no "best" or "most prestigious subject combination. Students should choose one that is most ideal for based on interests, aptitude and aspiration for post-secondary education.

# GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR ALLOCATION OF SUBJECT COMBINATIONS



#### **Evidence of demonstrated aptitude and ability**

- a. Secondary 2 Overall Results (NA/Exp) EMSHB2 E.g. **EL+M**aths+**S**ci+ **1H**um(Hist/Geog/Lit) + **B2** (Art/DT/FCE/MTL/HMTL)
- b. Secondary 2 Overall Subject Results e.g. 65% overall in History for Pure History

#### **Student's Preference**

Students should choose subject combinations based on their aptitude, interest and post-secondary options - submit their choices during the Subject Combination Exercise in October.

#### **Availability of Resources**

Subject combinations offered are subjected to availability of vacancies in each subject and school resources.






